APLA Health is a nonprofit health center that proudly provides nearly two dozen types of services to underserved communities across Los Angeles County. We provide culturally-competent care across all aspects of health and wellness, including medical services, dental services, mental healthcare, HIV specialty care and prevention, PrEP counseling and management, and health education.

Our lifestyle-focused approach to wellness also includes the largest-of-its-kind food pantry for those living with HIV, housing support for those experiencing housing instability, and support for older adults living with HIV/AIDS. We believe everyone deserves quality healthcare and support regardless of race, ethnicity, sexuality, gender identity, age, income, HIV status or zip code.

12,323 people in medical, dental and behavioral health care.


2,000 people living with HIV/AIDS in medical care.

MOBILIZE YOUR SQUAD

APLA HEALTH TALKING POINTS

We were founded in 1983 as AIDS Project Los Angeles with the goal of ending the AIDS epidemic in Los Angeles County. Today, we provide services in four key areas:

- 1** Primary medical care, dental, behavioral health and HIV specialty care
- 2** Critical HIV support services
- 3** HIV Prevention
- 4** Advocacy

AIDS Project Los Angeles became APLA Health in 2014 because we knew that health and wellness were inextricably tied to ending the HIV epidemic. By becoming a federally qualified health center and adding primary care to our portfolio, we added more tools to the fight.



Recent medical advances including U=U (Undetectable=Untransmittable), PrEP and PEP, allow us to imagine living in a county without any new HIV infections.



Our HIV prevention programs provide education, support and resources for those most at risk for contracting HIV, particularly young gay and bisexual men from communities of color, and transgender women.



Our clinics are strategically located throughout Los Angeles County so that as many people as possible can access them. We also provide parking and transportation support.



The majority of our clients live on less than \$24,280 a year. Our support services help alleviate some of their daily stresses so they can focus on maintaining their health.



We are fierce advocates for guaranteed access to quality and culturally-competent healthcare. We're always looking for innovative ways to improve services and fighting against attempts to take healthcare rights away.



We have recently launched HIVE (HIV-Elders) to help address the needs of an aging population living with HIV/AIDS, created women-focused health programs, and expanded our programs to combat substance abuse.

AIDS Walk Los Angeles is APLA Health's largest outreach event, and was the first AIDS Walk in the world. AWLA has raised more than \$88 million since the first Walk in 1985.
